

## Town of Homecroft Police Liaison Report

### Training

Officers conducted training this month on dry-fire practice and proper handgun techniques.

### Noteworthy Events in January 2022

New transportation policies are now in place mandating that Homecroft Officers are required to self-transport their prisoners to the new jail in Twin Aire at 695 Justice Way. Exceptions to that policy are active resisters who are charged with violent felonies. So far, the policy has not created noteworthy problems, although it is unfortunate that the officer's are required to be out of the community for extended periods of time as they drop off prisoners and await on them to be processed by jail staff.

Officer Derek Wilson pursued and apprehended juveniles that were involved in recent armed robberies around the Greenwood Park Mall, and a carjacking in the Greentree Apartments near Stop 11 and Madison. Kudos to Officer Wilson for a job well done.

### January 2022 HPD Statistics

In January 2022, HPD collectively worked 677 hours protecting our town and its residents. They drove a combined 5,080 miles; in those miles, they issued 110 city ordinance tickets, 12 state citations, and 110 warning tickets. They made two physical arrests, worked 6 crash reports, and towed 12 vehicles. They were primary officers on 63 calls for service and assisted on 95 other calls.

### 2021 Annual Report

I am very pleased to present the first Homecroft Police Department 2021 Annual Report. I requested that the Chief prepare an annual report that created a permanent record of HPD activities throughout the year. He tasked Major Jason Holland with creating this report, and he did an outstanding job. It is exactly what I had envisioned. This report will give council members today and far into the future a historical record of the amazing work of our HPD team and paints a clear picture of the great efforts they take to make our community a safe and inviting place for residents and guests, but a place that criminals want to avoid. Well done, Major; each HPD member can be very proud of this report.

### Insurance/Police-involved crash 01/15/2022/Discussion & direction by the board is needed...

On January 15, 2022, Asst. Chief Hodge was involved in a crash with another motorist on Madison near Southview. The insurance company representative present at the December 29, 2021 town council meeting stated we were moving to a "stated value" insurance policy at the start of the year wherein that vehicle would be covered for \$49,970.00. Since the crash incident there has been discussion that due to an error by their marketing department the replacement should be actual case value (about \$16,000) but because they were reportedly mis-advised they were offering \$31,329 minus a \$1,000 deductible (\$30,329.00). The Chief requests direction from the board in how to respond to this offer.

**ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING CUMULATIVE CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT FUND**

**Under Indiana Code 36-9-15.5.**

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Homecroft Town Council of Marion, County, Indiana that a need now exists for the establishment of a Cumulative Capital Development Fund for the following purposes:

For all uses as set out in IC 36-9-15.5-2.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Town Council will adhere to the provisions of Indiana Code 36-9-15.5. The proposed fund will not exceed:

- \$ 0.0167 per \$100 of assessed valuation beginning with taxes payable in 2023,
- \$ 0.0333 per \$100 of assessed valuation beginning with taxes payable in 2024, and
- \$ 0.0500 per \$100 of assessed valuation beginning with taxes payable in 2025 and thereafter.




Continuing until reduced or rescinded. Said tax rate will be levied beginning with taxes for 2022 payable 2023.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that proofs of publication of the public hearing held on the 27th day of January, 2022, and a certified copy of this ordinance shall be submitted to the Department of Local Government Finance of the State of Indiana as provided by law. This Cumulative Fund is subject to the approval of the Department of Local Government Finance.


