We heard back from Citizens Energy Group regarding the drainage issues on Loretta, and they said that those stormwater assets are under the oversight of DPW and not Citizens. We have asked for the name of a good person to contact at DPW so we can hopefully get someone to help us. We have yet to hear back, even with a second email. If we don't get anything by the end of this week, we will reach out to the department chair at the Board of Public Works (Daniel Parker) for advice on who could best help us.

Morphey Construction has said that they will be out in September to add more soil and grass seed in the areas along Maynard that they missed or that have settled considerably since the end of the project last fall. They are also trying to get a specific date scheduled for the concrete repairs and work, which the concrete company says they hope to have done in September also.

There was a report of some rain water runoff from a company in Southport onto the property of a Homecroft resident near Homestead and Tulip. It is not easily visible from the road, so I'm trying to get connected with the resident to explore the issues a little further.
