



Police Liaison Report to the Homecroft Town Council June 2024 Report for the July 25, 2024 Council Meeting

Dear Fellow Council Members et al:

17 members of the Homecroft Police Department contributed 453 cumulative hours protecting and serving the residents and visitors of Homecroft in June 2024.

While patrolling 3,325 miles, officers wrote 79 town ordinance tickets (14 state tickets) and issued 41 warning citations. Their enforcement efforts resulted in 17 vehicles being towed. They oversaw 54 total calls for service and assisted with 55 other calls for service. Officers worked 6 crash incidents. Most of the service calls were agency assist runs helping the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department with calls in the vicinity of town.

In June, monthly training focused on report writing and new property room procedures; the later was necessary because the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department decided to eliminate overnight staffing of the property room; as such, new rules, procedures, and policies governing admission and storage of property was put into place.

The new Durango was upfitted and graphics were applied to the exterior of the newest Charger in preparation for National Night out. In other news, three steel plate vests were donated to the department, and we are thankful to have them.

On July 8, 2024, a call was dispatched in the 7700 blk of Portage Avenue reporting a person shot (CAD 0582). Homecroft Police Officer Dawn Asbury responded to the scene arriving within two minutes of the report. She quickly and calmly assessed the scene and reported back that there was a confirmed person shot, and that the individual was in critical condition, adding that he was exhibiting agonal respirations. At great personal danger to herself not knowing who the shooter was nor where the shooter was located, she initiated CPR until the arrival of IFD and IEMS. The man was transported to the hospital where at last check, he remained in critical condition. While I do not know if he survived or not, the calm nature exhibited by Officer Asbury and the act of service to another above the safety of herself deserves recognition. Thank you Dawn for a job well done.

We must steadfastly continue to be vigilant, highly visible, leverage available technologies, strengthen partnerships, and prepare our officers with the best training & equipment possible to respond to and abate violence in and near our town.
