

Several streetlights have been reported to AES and repaired over the last month.

We are waiting to hear about our Community Crossings Grant application that would help us fund necessary repairs to the intersection of the Madison frontage road and Loretta Dr.

Police Liaison Report to the Town Council

15 Members of the Homecroft Police Department contributed 543 cumulative hours protecting and serving residents and visitors of the town in October 2022.

While patrolling 3,401 miles, officers wrote 149 town ordinance tickets, 5 state tickets, and issued 105 warnings citations. Their enforcement efforts resulted in 20 vehicles towed. They oversaw 80 total calls for service and assisted with 71 other calls for service. Most of these service calls were agency assist runs helping the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department with calls in the vicinity of town.

On Sunday, October 2nd at about 0245 hours, 3 people were shot in the 1100 blk of Maynard Drive in Homecroft. All survived and IMPD Aggravated Assault is investigating the incident.

In response, on October 3, 2022, HPD set up a well-attended (37) seminar to teach town residents how to lessen their chances of becoming a victim of crime.

Councilor Wolfe applied for a JAG Grant through the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute requesting a grant for four different projects: 1) increasing the Chief's salary by \$10,000, 2) obtaining 6 body cameras for \$14,610.54, 3) obtaining FLOCK cameras & their related installation costs for \$22,800, and 4) obtaining Lexipol Subscription cost coverage for \$2,615.53. The total request in this grant was for \$40,026.07. We await word from ICJI to see if we will be granted this funding. In addition, a new solicitation from the Indiana Department of Homeland Security is being offered to support a matching grant partially funding body camera programs. If we are unsuccessful obtaining body cams through the JAG grant, Wolfe will apply for matching funding through the IDHS body camera program if requested by the full council to do so.
