Town of Homecroft Police Liaison Report

October 28, 2021

Training

Officers conducted training on two topics: Felony traffic stops and active shooter situations. Officers were refreshed on safe techniques of stopping cars when the occupants are known or suspected felons, suspects in an incident that just occurred where they were believed to be armed with deadly weapon(s), as well as refreshers on how to approach and respond to an active shooter incident. These scenarios will almost always involve multi-jurisdictional responses in our area since we are surrounded by multiple law enforcement agencies (Perry School Police, IMPD, MCSO, Southport PD, ISP, Greenwood, Community Hospital Police, etc.) Making sure to train to a uniform standard so other assisting officers know how we will respond to these scenarios is a critical key to keeping officers safe. Officers from the Marion University Police Department joined HPD in this training event.

Officer's Social Event

HPD members gathered recently to enjoy an away-from-the-badge social evening together. Officers pitched-in to provide a variety of comestibles; everyone had a wonderful time, and it was notable that all members but four were in attendance.

Perry Schools paid to recently have the water heater replaced. The lock system for the doors needs upgraded; the Chief is exploring options and integrating options for the alarm company so that both upgrades might be completed simultaneously and might also work together in concert. The Chief reports that 75% of the items which needed thrown away in the basement have been cleared out.
